To give them a push forward, we will provide support starting with life assistance, including cultural understanding promotion, Japanese language support, and approaches to companies.

③ Projects to Promote Healthy Development of Children
There are children who cannot find their place even in schools, which should be environments with many friends where they can learn enjoyably, or even in their homes, which should be the safest places, and who suffer from feelings of "confinement" and "loneliness." This may be partly due to the weakening of warm human connections caused by rapid technological
advancement and the complexity of urban life, which accelerates the difficulty of living.
The heart formed during precious childhood has a significant impact even in adulthood. Wishing for the healthy growth of precious children who will carry the future, we will help with initiatives that nurture children's mental and physical health improvement, enhance their intellectual and social adaptive abilities, and enrich their emotional development.
